The Master Plan for the University of Alabama in Huntsville establishes a unified campus filled with student life and activity. Proposed changes includes the development of a residential zone on the north end of campus removing existing parking lots to create a central quad lined with a mix of existing and proposed residential halls. The plan sites residential units within a mixed-use village. Centrally located, the mixed-use development activates the campus and reconnects the north and south ends of campus.

The Master Plan sites new facilities throughout campus based on UAH's needs. Expansion of the existing University Center, Performing Arts Center, Liberal Arts School, and expansion of the Administrative Sciences complex are planned for North Campus. Central Campus will include a Greek Housing Complex, intramural fields, Administration Building and Visitor's Center, and Transportation ASB. South Campus will receive an athletic complex and the addition of new Research and Development buildings along with existing science and technology buildings.
